### Great Start to Quality—Michigan’s Tiered Quality Rating and Improvement System

In October, Michigan introduced Great Start to Quality, Michigan’s Quality Rating and Improvement System. This system is designed to promote the overall health and development of children in early care and education and to provide support for early childhood professionals in moving along a continuum of quality. All licensed child care providers enter the system at a level one and can progress to the highest level of quality, a level five. No ratings will be publicized during this first year of implementation.

#### How do providers access Great Start to Quality?

Providers access Great Start to Quality through their profile on Great Start CONNECT. Go to: <http://greatstartforkids.org/connect/> Click the “log in” button and then the “provider” tab. Enter email and password. Once in profile, click on the “Great Start to Quality” link on the upper right hand corner.

#### How do providers navigate the Tiered Quality Rating and Improvement System?

The system is comprised of a program profile, self assessment survey, and a quality improvement plan. Programs begin by completing their program profile and then move to the self assessment survey. The self assessment survey is based on the Michigan Early Childhood Standards. The survey has five sections: Early Childhood Educator Qualifications and Professional Development; Family and Community Partnerships; Administration and Management; Environment; and Curriculum and

Instruction.

Each section has a series of quality indicators that may or may not be true for a program. A provider checks those indicators that apply. Scoring is done automatically. As providers progress through the self assessment survey, work should be saved. Once completed, providers click “submit for review.”

The self assessment survey is worth 50 points and providers will receive a **provisional** rating upon submitting their survey. **To achieve a level four or five rating, programs must undergo an independent assessment using the Program Quality Assessment (PQA) tool.**

The quality improvement component will go live in late December. This component allows providers to set quality improvement goals and pursue a higher quality rating.

#### How do providers get support through this process?

Additional information on the quality indicators can be found in the Michigan Early Childhood Standards. A link to the standards is located in the Great Start to Quality Message Center for easy access. Informational sessions on Great Start to Quality will be offered in the near future.
