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Topic	Discussion/Summary
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Introductions & Background	<p>Welcome, Ground Rules and Introductions- Renold conducted round-robin introductions, reviewed the Ground Rules & Shared Agreements and gave a reminder of using the raised hand feature in Zoom. Renold then opened the floor for agency updates.</p>
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Agency Updates	<p>Nick DeMott from Lifeboat announced they are reopening, offering hybrid recovery meetings and 1:1 peer recovery coaching. Computers are available for those doing job searches or attending online trainings. Rapid Response (R.R.) is implementing post overdose follow up calls and home visits with Darrick from the Health Department and James from Lifeboat. They are collaborating with Delhi and Williamston looking at how EMS can possibly share overdose data directly with their team.</p> <p>Dan Munford from MSU PD announced they are almost ready to start the Hope, Not Handcuffs program. They will be the pilot program and model for other police departments. While this has not been finalized, there will be media release coming soon.</p> <p>Phil Pavona from FAN expressed concern about a lack of substance use preventative education for youth and college students. He also requested updated data specific to substance use overdoses and deaths for Ingham and surrounding counties. He stressed the importance of knowing age ranges and communities effected so we can identify where we need to focus or adjust services.</p> <p>Nick Toodzio from Mason Capital Area Prescription Drug Task Force & Mason High School stated that prevention education within schools is at a standstill. Students are not able to attend educational substance use prevention assemblies, due to COVID restrictions. Currently, students are struggling with basic attendance and education. Nick mentioned Mason P.D. is still working to get the Hope Not Handcuffs program off the ground.</p> <p>Tammy Maidlow-Bresnahan reported the Ingham County Health Department (ICHHD) is offering free Zoom Naloxone trainings for groups or individuals in the Ingham County area. 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<p>Task Team Break-out summary report</p>	<p>Renold had a brief discussion, and broke teams into their 30-minute break out sessions. Groups discussed their current projects, deciding if they want to move forward or change to a different project. Teams discussed project goals and kick off activities. They brainstormed what project success would look like and any possible barriers that could impact their projects. Once the breakout sessions were over, everyone returned to the main meeting room. Each group provided a brief summary.</p> <p>Harm Reduction Sub Committee Task Team Members in Attendance - Nick DeMott, Jessica Yoroko, and Darrick Miller</p> <p>Summary- Nick DeMott reported they are working on a PR project to raise awareness to the importance of harm reduction. They would also like to change local ordinances surrounding paraphernalia. Jessica Yoroko shared graphics from outside organizations that explain Harm Reduction. These graphics can be located at the link below: https://drive.google.com/drive/folders/1EwxQQiks684xdg17nvR_dzaeYRZRPA0h?usp=sharing</p> <p>Jessica also sent an email to IOAPI members titled Harm Reduction Educational Graphics on 1/7/21, with more great information.</p> <p>Social & Media Support Subcommittee Task Team Members in attendance- Phil Pavona, Jessica Martin, Rebecca Emmenecker, Tracy Skinner and Emilia McConnell (LPD-intern).</p> <p>Summary- Emilia spoke for the group. They identified 3 big projects and will make their decision next month. They would like to make a listing of peer recovery coaches throughout different organizations. They also discussed potentially helping providers by working on a HIPPA compliant skeleton form, so there is more continuity of care. Lastly, they discussed creating distributable educational materials for the community. These materials will describe substance use disorders, and the recovery process.</p> <p>Prevention and Early Intervention Subcommittee Task Team Members in Attendance- Tammy Maidlow-Bresnahan, Nick Toodzio, Joel Hoepfner, Andrea Ryan, Dan Munford,. Dr. Alane Laws Barker, Dr, Ron Charles</p> <p>Summary- Nick and Joel spoke for the group. Their project focuses on a communication plan to get SUD information into the community. They are working on a list of access points where they can send TV/video spots from past projects. The group feels the best way to reach younger people is through social media.
