Introductions & Background	Welcome, Ground Rules and Introductions- Renold conducted round-robin introductions, reviewed the Ground Rules & Shared Agreements.	
Agency Updates	<p>Guest Speaker: Jonas Ndeke, MD, MPH. Ingham County Health Department, Community Epidemiologist. Title of presentation: <i>IOAPI Opioid Surveillance- Indicators and Usefulness</i>. Jonas delivered a great presentation with a lot of detailed opioid related data, specific to Ingham County. Renold JeanLouis emailed a copy of the Power Point and video of this presentation to all IOAPI members on 3/9/21.</p> <p>Agency Updates</p> <p>Nick Toodzio announced that Mason P.D. has begun training for the Hope Not Handcuffs Program. Currently, there are 14 police departments involved in Hope Not Handcuffs in Clinton, Eaton and Ingham County. Nick also asked about online Naloxone training for law enforcement, which ICHHD responded that they are able to provide online training using Zoom.</p> <p>Jessica Yorko mentioned that during the most recent Opioid Settlement meeting, recommendations were collected and sent to Linda Vail regarding how to use the possible opioid settlement funds. The recommendations were then forwarded to Dana Nessel. Jessica will check for any updates or new information regarding timing and amounts for potential uses of opioid settlement funds.</p> <p>Carol Siemon mentioned she would reach out to attorney David Middleman, who is involved in the Ingham County opioid settlement suit, to see if there has been any movement. She will share any information she receive with the IOAPI group.</p> <p>Nick DeMott shared that East Lansing PD and MSU PD has joined Rapid Response. Nick believes Rapid Response will be responding to an increase number of overdoses. He is looking for more funding to increase staff capacity in order to support the increase of Rapid Respond cases.</p> <p>Renold JeanLouis mentioned ICHHD continues to provide Naloxone training to individuals and groups using the Zoom. After training, Tammy coordinates dates and times to distribute Naloxone kits. Please share the link http://hd.ingham.org/SeekingCare/SubstanceUse/Naloxone.aspx</p> <p>Tammy Maidlow-Bresnahan announced there have been a few additions to the Resource Directory for individuals and Families impacted by Substance Use Disorders.</p> <p>Neal Perry from CHC announced he will be presenting at IOAPI meeting in May. CHC provides services to adolescents and families for substance use disorders. They provide in person and telehealth services and can make referrals for Medication Assisted Treatment services.</p>
