<b>Introductions &amp; Background</b>	<b>Welcome, Ground Rules and Introductions-</b> Renold conducted round-robin introductions, reviewed the Ground Rules & Shared Agreements.	
<b>Agency Updates</b>	<p><b>Dani Meier</b> shared that MSHN is looking into the disparity treatment African Americans face from their medical providers when trying to access pain management services. National research shows that people of color face many health disparities when trying to access pain management services, substance use disorder services and often receive lower doses of methadone during Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT). MSHN wants to access reports looking at data from different treatment and methadone providers in Michigan to identify where these disparities exist.</p> <p><b>Andrea Ryan</b> reported that Ingham Substance Abuse Prevention (ISAP) is hosting a free, virtual community event called the Empowerment Series. Each Tuesday in June from 12-1, there will be a different topic. The next events are June 22<sup>th</sup>- Trauma, SUD and the Pandemic and June 29<sup>th</sup> Tobacco Reduction Basics. Anyone interested can sign up online. An event flyer was shared with all IOAPI members.</p> <p><b>Nick DeMott</b> shared that Lifeboat will be expanding their Rapid Response work to include home visiting. They also wants to expand outreach services to homeless communities to help navigate people to services. Lastly, they have planted a community garden behind their building on Burchfield right off of Holmes near the Kroger on MLK and could use more gardeners if anyone is interested in helping.</p> <p><b>Neil Perry</b> shared their grant program; Families Matter, works with the Opioid Affected Youth Initiative for Ingham County families with youth between the ages of 11-17 who have been affected by opioid and other substance use disorders. Case managers can follow adolescents for up to 9 months. The Strengthen Families Program is an 11 week family group program being held virtually on Zoom. They have also implemented Collaborative Assessment and Management of Suicidality (CAMS) as part of their zero suicide framework. They want to help people experiencing suicidal ideation stay safe and out of the hospital. Their trained therapist can provide intervention for those struggling.</p> <p><b>Tammy Maidlow-Bresnahan</b> announced the Tobacco Use Reduction Program (TURP) will attend the Juneteenth Celebration at Alfreda Schmidt Southside Community Center on June 19<sup>th</sup> from 12-5. Calvin Wheeler from TURP will discuss the significance of the upcoming menthol ban for the African American community. Distributable materials available will include the TURP Brochure, Substance Use Disorder Resource Guides, Naloxone training flyers and other Health Promotion and Prevention materials for the community.</p>

<p><b>Task Team - Breakout Rooms</b></p>	<p><b>Renold JeanLouis</b> announced the Breast and Cervical Cancer Control Navigation Program helps uninsured and underinsured women get access to free pap/pelvic and screening mammograms in Ingham and surrounding counties. The Youth Vape and Marijuana Prevention project is in the final stages, teenagers will be able to subscribe to ICHD text service where they can receive health and preventative information on vaping and marijuana and receive incentives. The TURP Program helps People Living with HIV (PLWH) get access to 1:1 counseling services to help people develop a quit plan to reduce and quit using tobacco. One representative from each group provided a brief summary after everyone returned to the main room.</p> <p><b>Harm Reduction Sub Committee Members in attendance</b>– Nick DeMott, Sarah Kenney, Da’Neese Wells and Darrick Miller. Unable to attend: Jessica Yoroko, Carol Siemon, Kellie Zurek, Chris Martin and Jason Blanks. Nick spoke for the group. They are working on a public awareness campaign, to educate the community on harm reduction resources and promote services for people in need. They would like to set up a meeting with Lansing Syringe Access, and hope to meet with the Fledge to discuss a possible Harm Reduction street team and a mobile recovery unit. His team discussed a mobile health clinic to do harm reduction outreach in areas with heavy drug traffic to help people in need get access to care.</p> <p><b>Social &amp; Medical Support Subcommittee Task Members in attendance</b>- Neal Perry and Jessica Martin. Unable to attend: Rebecca Emmenecker, Phil Pavona Emilia McConnell, Jane Bidwell, Mike Tobias, Tracy Skinner. Jessica gave the summary. They are compiling a comprehensive list of local peer support and recovery coaches programs in the tri-county area. It was identified that there’s adequate information/resources for Eaton and Ingham County but more research/information is needed for what’s going on in Clinton county. Once the list is compiled and completed, it will be shared.</p> <p><b>Prevention and Early Intervention Subcommittee Members in attendance</b>- Tammy Maidlow-Bresnahan, Joel Hoepfner, Nick Toodzio, Dr. Alane Laws-Barker, Andrea Ryan and Tamara Jordan. Unable to attend: Dr. Ronald Charles, Dan Munford, Maria Medina and Andrea Carlson. Tammy spoke for the group. They continue working on a communication plan to get SUD information into the community. They are finalizing their list of community contacts and are collecting health screening information, videos and community resources and uploading to a google shared drive. They hope to reach out to their networks soon, to ask them to post their collection of SUD resources to their websites.</p>
