Pre-COVID-19, the group was in discussion about using real time data for potential interventions for overdose survivors whose survival may</p>

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	<p>have been attributed to Naloxone administration.</p> <p><u>Social and Medical Support- Team Members:</u> Jan Bidwell (Coordinator), Justin Caughey, Phil Pavona, Annette Jones, Mike Tobias, Dawn Kepler</p> <p><i>Update-</i> This group has not met due to COVID-19. Annette Jones mentioned for individuals without insurance or for those who cannot afford the cost, the state gave pre-paid forms for individuals who need HIV, STD and Hepatitis testing. Nick Toodzio mentioned he has a new position as the District Healthy Environment Coordinator (Covid Czar). He is busy getting schools ready for back to school. Also, due to COVID-19, the Mason Police Department has put the Hope Not Handcuffs Program on hold for the time being.</p>

Closing and Outros	<p>Ann Scott is no longer with the health center. Joel Murr is now the acting director if the Ingham Health Centers.</p> <p>Harm Reduction Michigan is now authorized to provide syringe exchange in Ingham County, and Punks with Lunch Lansing works under this nonprofit umbrella</p> <p>ICHD Health Officer and County Board of Commissioners has declared racism as a public health crisis. ICHD is looking at all programs and services to find out what does a racial equity lens look like, including in SUD work.</p> <p>It was announced that ICHD began a Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) at the Ingham County Jail before COVID-19. Pathways to Care Darrick Miller has been going onto the jail to support and assist clients with SUD by helping them get into inpatient and outpatient therapies upon their release.
