<b>Introductions &amp; Background</b>	<p><b>Welcome, Ground Rules and Introductions-</b> Renold JeanLouis, conducted round-robin introductions, reviewed Ground Rules &amp; Shared Agreements and gave a reminder of using the raised hand feature in Zoom. There was a brief recap of the meeting minutes from the August 6, IOAPI meeting. Renold introduced the guest speaker Phil Pavona from Families Against Narcotics (FAN). IOAPI members provided updates in their areas. Subcommittees/Task Team members provided updates for their groups.</p>	
<b>Agenda Item Discussion</b>	<p><b>Phil Pavona, founder of Ingham County’s Families Against Narcotics (FAN), presentation-</b> <i>Community Services Offered by Families Against Narcotics-</i> FAN’s overarching goals include changing the face and stigma of addiction, prevention, family forums and having an impact. FAN meetings are the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday every month at 7 pm on Facebook. A 12 Step Parent Recovery Meeting is pilot program that is available by invite only, at this time. The Stronger Together 12 Steps will be available as an attachment.</p> <p><b>Agency updates</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Michael from the Ingham Medical Examiner’s office reports a significant increase of opioid related deaths in the first two quarters of 2020, with 64 certified opioid related deaths so far this year. In 2019, there were 89 opioid related deaths. In 2018, there were 83 opioid related deaths. Methamphetamine deaths are also rising with 11 related deaths reported in the last quarter.</li> <li>• Carol from Ingham County Prosecutors office reports they are seeing increases in child abuse, domestic violence, shootings and drug usage. People in the community are feeling stressed and are struggling to get their supportive needs met.</li> <li>• Phil from FAN reported Hope Not Handcuffs had been virtually helping people get access to treatment. Police lobbies are beginning to reopen, so Angels will be able to do intakes in person for those asking for help getting into treatment for a substance use disorder. Virtual state rallies include Walk a Mile on 9/29/2020 in support of Mental Health Awareness, American Foundation of Suicide Prevention is virtual on 9/26/2020, the State Conference is virtual from 9/21- 25<sup>th</sup>. The Recovery Event scheduled for 9/19 was postponed, but they hope this can be rescheduled when face-to-face meetings can happen safely. ISAP has been discussing supporting recovery month by providing pizza and salad dinners to various recovery houses, and hopes to use local businesses.</li> <li>• Renold from ICHD reported updates to the ICHD website, including the ICHD Resource Guide for Individuals and Families Impacted by Substance Use Disorders. Directions to this guide were included in last month's meeting notes. The IOAPI page on ICHD's website is being updated and will include the IOAPI meeting schedule, past meeting minutes and Power Point Presentations from past guest speakers.</li> </ul> <p><b>Subcommittees/Task Team Updates</b></p> <p><b><u>Harm Reduction</u></b>- Team members: Nick DeMott (Coordinator), Sarah Kenney, Dana Watson</p> <p>Updates- 1). Punks with Lunch (PWL) is now authorized to do needle exchange. They are looking to expand their efforts and are checking into different funding possibilities. Jessica Yorke from ICHD has been collaborating with Julia from PWL to support these efforts. 2). Rapid Response (RR) is hoping to start soon. This is a collaboration between the sheriff's office and community agencies. In the event that a person overdoses and survives, the RR team will quickly reach out to the person &amp; family to provide resources and hopefully get them into treatment. Darrick from Pathways at ICHD has agreed to go with officers in the event of an overdose to provide support services. 3). Nick De Mott interviewed several members of RR and found the morale was low due to lack of results and clarity about purpose/roles of the group. Changes were made in the communication process with the hopes of seeing improvement but not much changed due to patients' refusal to sign the consent form for services and follow up. RR would like to include home visiting, recovery coaching and wellness checks.</p> <p><b><u>Data Communication and Integration</u></b>- Team Members: Jonas Ndeke (Coordinator), Daryl Green, Amanda Darche, Debbie Edokpolo</p> <p>Updates- Jonas Ndeke, Ingham County Health Department epidemiologist and coordinator for this group reached out via email.
