- 2015 milestones:*
- Identified stakeholders to join (cross-sector)
 - Focused on collaboration with non-traditional partners
 - Identified metrics & data sources
 - Created and distributed monthly surveillance report
 - Identified impact areas and coalition structure
 - Convened first meeting in April 2015 as “Ingham Opioid Workgroup”
 - Created Opioid Toolkit
 - Lots of groundwork done for public launch of IOAPI in 2016
 - Billboard campaign on “capital counties commit”
 - 2014-2015, Lansing Police Chief Mike Yankowski sent staff to trainings across the country regarding the opioid crisis, and LPD officers and other police force and staff began accepting and using naloxone

2016

- 2017 milestones:*
- Created IOAPI Strategic Action Plan
 - IOAPI formed subcommittees* focused on Harm Reduction/Criminal Justice, Data/Surveillance, Education/Awareness, and Prescribing Practices
 - IOAPI members completed Memorandums of Understanding to outline their participation
 - Ingham County Health Dept. worked with CEI-CMH to access naloxone kits and provide kits and education to the community
 - Sponsored airing of “Chasing the Dragon” on WILX Channel 10
 - Presented to City of Lansing regarding drug paraphernalia law / ordinance change to allow for syringe exchange
 - Updated Opioid Toolkit
 - ICHD provided naloxone and naloxone training to members of 55th District Court (in Mason)

2017

- 2019 milestones:*
- Shared “Carry Naloxone: Save a Life” media campaign
 - Continued providing Naloxone training & kits
 - Developed partnership between Lansing Syringe Access, Grand Rapids Red Project and ICHD to offer free syringe exchange at Lansing Area Aids Network
 - Planned 1st Annual Capital Area Pain Conference for February 2020
 - Won a spot in the national “Building Bridges” project – a Planning Initiative to Build Bridges Between Jail and Community-Based Treatment for Opioid Use Disorder, with specific focus on Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) in jails
 - Formed internal ICHD opioid workgroup
 - Updated Opioid Toolkit

2015

- 2016 milestones:*
- Press conference held in January 2016 to inform public of local impact of opioid epidemic
 - Changed name of the group to Ingham Opioid Abuse Prevention Initiative (IOAPI)
 - Ingham County Health Dept. received licensure to be a prevention-providing agency in Ingham County and ICHD staff became members of the 55th district Specialty Court team
 - Updated Opioid Toolkit
 - ICHD accepted grant from Blue Cross Blue Shield Foundation of Michigan to build capacity for jail-based responses to opioid crises

2019

- 2018 milestones:*
- Created Pain Brochure
 - Provided Naloxone training to more than thirty (30) different groups and distributed more than 100 Naloxone kits
 - Established partnership between Ingham County Health Dept. and Ingham County Jail to expand scope of Pathways to Care program to provide Community Health Worker jail-visiting among jail residents with opioid use disorder or opioid use concerns
 - Updated Opioid Toolkit
 - Began tracking child custody removals due to Substance Use Disorder
 - Acquired Capital Counties Commit website (www.capitalcountiescommit.org/)
 - MOA signed for LPD Trial of Angel Program; as well as 12 other regional police chiefs signed on. Also called Hope Not Handcuffs”; it was a bit iffy/ more of a pilot bc not enough volunteer “Angels” signed up to help; the program really comes from Michigan State Police and they are really the ones running the program now
 - 2018-2019 Mason Prescription Drug Task Force created
 - ICHD Pathways to Care CHW’s began working with opioid-involved individuals at the Ingham County Jail
