Exciting news! The Michigan Registry (miregistry) is coming soon! The registry is an online platform that will support professionals (family, group, and center based providers) in the early childhood and school age workforce with locating, documenting and quantifying your professional growth and accomplishments.

The Michigan Registry will provide a statewide calendar of training opportunities beginning March 1, 2018. On February 8, 2018 providers can search for training that occur March 1<sup>st</sup> or later at miregistry.org. Trainings will continue to be posted through February 28<sup>th</sup> on the Great Start to Quality training calendar at greatstarttoquality.org. Providers can access miregistry.org directly or they can be directed from the greatstarttoquality.org website.

Highlights of the Michigan Registry:

- Providers will create an individual profile that will store training certificates/transcripts in a secure and confidential file.
- Providers will have access to their own individual profile to show evidence to meet child care licensing, Great Start to Quality, Child Development Associate, NAEYC, and/or the Michigan School Age Youth Development Certificate/Credential.
- Providers can use their registry profile as a tool for comprehensive resume building.
- Providers will have access to statewide training events with online registration and automatic verification of training hours for training offered through the Michigan Registry.











Step 1- Visit [Office for Young Children Home Page](#) and click on the **Power Hour Modules** link.

Step 3- Select the training you would like to complete and read the information.

Step 4- Using the printed form (see step 2) fill in your answers and complete the registration information portion at the bottom and mail in with your payment, \$15.00 for each hour module. A certificate of completion for one hour per module will be mailed upon review of the work.

- C. For **all Correspondence** training click on the correspondence button- you will see options from all of the state resource centers- all OYC trainings start with "OYC" in the title.
